College Sub-Schools

Colac Secondary College provides modern classrooms for the 21st Century where each learning space is designed to meet the needs of today's students.

Our College is arranged into 2 distinct Sub-Schools: 1. Junior Year 7, 8 and 9 Sub-School

The Junior Sub-School has two locations: a Year 7 & 8 Community and a separate Year 9 Area.

2. Senior Year 10, 11 and 12 Sub-School

The Senior Sub-School is focussed on pathways: VCE, VCE Vocational Major and TAFE. Each student has a managed individual pathway preparing students to enter tertiary education (university), an apprenticeship or the workforce when they graduate.



Each Learning Community provides a safe and stimulating environment in which students learn and work with a core team of teaching and support staff, and are underpinned by the notion that it takes a 'village to raise a child'. The design of our learning spaces offers the opportunity for teachers to work independently or in teams where the individual and diverse needs of students can be fully catered for in different settings and with varied teaching techniques. This allows all our students to maximise their own potential in an engaging and stimulating environment.



Daily Organisation

Colac Secondary College operate on a 5-day timetable.

There are 5 teaching sessions per day with a break between sessions 2 & 3 and 4 & 5. The duration of each session is 55 minutes.

Year 7 & 8 Curriculum

English and Humanities

Our English and Humanities subjects are prescribed within the Victorian Curriculum framework. In English, students undertake structured literacy approaches to emphasize highly explicit and systematic teaching of all important components of literacy such as:

Reading and Viewing

Students develop an understanding of how texts are influenced by context, purpose and audience. Students develop their reading skills and are involved in understanding, interpreting, analysing and reflecting upon a wide range of texts.

Writing

Students develop an understanding of writing skills. Students are involved in the planning, composing, editing and production of a range of texts. This involves students gaining an understanding of text structures and language features.

Speaking and Listening

Students learn to analyse, understand, communicate and build relationships with others and with the world around them. Effective communication is a major focus for the development of speaking and listening skills. Students undertake a range of strategies to develop such skills.

Humanities Topics

In Humanities we also find out more about the world we live in.

Year 7:

History – Ancient Australia and Ancient Civilisation Geography – Water in the World, Place and Liveability Civics – Government, Our Legal System Business and Economics – Business environment (local level)

Assessment

Throughout the year, Common Assessment Tasks (CATs) focus upon students demonstrating their understanding of imaginative, narrative, persuasive and informative texts. CATs assess students' writing and reading levels and provide formative feedback in five weekly cycles to assist in continual learning growth and reflection.

French (LOTE)

Students have the opportunity to learn the French language and explore French culture. Through listening, speaking, reading, and writing, they develop their communication skills while gaining an understanding of global perspectives.

Learning French also deepens cultural awareness, helping students appreciate different ways of life. Lessons include interactive activities, exposure to native speakers, and online resources to support language development.



Mathematics

In Year 7, students engage with a variety of learning resources to support their mathematical development. Teachers use a structured lesson model to explicitly teach key concepts and skills, building a strong foundation for success in VCE and beyond. Students have opportunities to practise skills and apply their knowledge until they achieve fluency.

Both in-class and standardised assessments allow students to demonstrate their understanding and receive targeted feedback for improvement. Mathematics in Years 7–10 follows the Victorian Curriculum, with differentiated instruction to support diverse learning needs.

Health and Physical Education (HAPE)

Health Education

In Health Education, students develop knowledge, skills and behaviours that promote their physical, mental, social and emotional health. In Year 7, students will explore the specific areas of Body Systems, Bullying (including Cyber Bullying), Nutrition, Smoking and Respectful Relationships.

Physical Education

Physical Education provides students with an opportunity to develop movement skills, games strategies, theoretical concepts, and the ability to work effectively in teams. This is achieved through participation in a range of individual and team activities. With consistent participation, students will enhance their skills, fitness, teamwork and self-confidence.

Science

In Year 7 Science, students build essential knowledge and skills through teacher-led explicit instruction. Lessons are designed to systematically develop their understanding of key scientific concepts, preparing them for further study in science.

Teachers guide students through fundamental principles of scientific inquiry, introducing them to observation, experimentation, and critical analysis. Explicit instruction ensures students grasp core concepts in chemistry, biology, physics, and earth and space sciences. They learn how scientific knowledge is structured, applied, and extended through investigation.

Regular assessments and guided practice reinforce learning, ensuring students gain the confidence and competence needed for success in higher levels of science education.



Arts

In Year 7, students engage in a semester-long exploration of visual and performing arts. Through hands-on learning experiences, they develop creative and imaginative skills across a range of disciplines.



Art

Students explore creative expression and develop imaginative thinking through various artistic techniques. They create artworks using a range of media, including pencils, pastels, paint, and clay.

Visual Communication Design Students learn the fundamentals of design and visual communication. They develop skills in using signs, symbols, and technical drawing methods such as perspective.

Dance and Drama

Students build foundational skills in Dance and Drama through individual and group activities. They participate in role play, improvisation, performances, and script work while analysing and evaluating their own work and the work of others.

Music

Music is a practical, hands-on subject. Year 7 students learn to play the piano/keyboard and ukulele, engage in aural activities, and develop basic music theory skills. They compose small pieces using Soundtrap and other digital tools. Music becomes an elective from Year 9, with opportunities to continue through to Year 12.

Technology

Year 7 students will study each subject for one semester. Students have the opportunity to experience a range of technology specialities within the technology domain, where they can enjoy developing their design and

technical skills through hands on learning experiences.

Food Technologies

In the kitchen students will learn Health, Hygiene and OH&S skills relevant to the kitchen and food handling. They will learn how to use a variety of kitchen tools and equipment safely and how to carry out common food processes. Each week they will experience the enjoyment of developing their technique and knowledge of food preparation by making a variety of food products.

Wood Technologies

Students will design and make various products using wood based materials. They will develop and enhance their practical skills in the workshop using a variety of hand tools and equipment. Safe work practices, OH&S and handling the tools and equipment safely is a major focus in yr 7.



Additional Programs



Sporting Opportunities at CSC

All students at Colac Secondary College are encouraged to participate in a wide variety of sporting activities in addition to the Physical Education curriculum. A series of highly structured interschool, region and state level competitions, across a large number of recognised sports, are also available for students as part of the sporting program offered at CSC.

All students are placed into a Sports House – Otway (Blue), Barwon (Green), Hesse (Red) or Murray (Yellow). Houses compete in Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country events throughout the year.

Colac Secondary College is a member of the Western Conference as part of School Sport Victoria (SSV). This provides our students with the opportunity to progress through to State level in a range of sports, including swimming, athletics, cross country, tennis, netball, football, badminton, cricket, soccer and basketball.

STRIVE – Regional Institute of Sport

STRIVE, previously Sporting Pathway Program, commenced in 2019 to give students the opportunity to learn and develop their athletic qualities of strength, speed, agility and mobility. Students from Year 7-12 undertake a specialised athletic development program to best prepare our athletes for elite sport in the future. A developmental pathway to sporting excellence.

CSC has been working with the Regional Institute of Sport Director Stuart Canavan who, along with exercise scientists from both Ballarat and Geelong universities, takes weekly movement pattern and strength training sessions. Students in the program are also given the opportunity to develop our understanding of the importance of a dynamic warm-up, goal setting, nutrition and the importance of resilience in the sporting context, whilst managing studies.

CSC Football Development Program

This special program is designed and led by Jonathan Simpkin, former AFL premiership player and current player at Colac Tigers Football Club. With years of experience playing and coaching at the highest level, Jonathan brings a wealth of knowledge and expertise to the role. He has a deep understanding of the game, including tactics, strategy, and player development, and is able to communicate this knowledge effectively to students.

Students within this program develop football skills within an inclusive learning environment. The young players will refine technical skills, decision-making skills and game strategies through ball-centred activities and modified games.



Dance Academy

The CSC Dance Academy welcomes students of all ages and abilities to learn and develop their skills in dance and performance. Students will work weekly on the following:

- · Weekly preparation for performance
- · Learning foundation dance technique for all styles of dance
- · Learning performance skills and presence on stage
- · Developing an understanding of safe dance practice and awareness of our body
- · Guiding students in developing their own movement and input into the creation of a show.

If you love dance this program may be for you! Come and give it a try! The program runs Tuesday evenings from 3.30pm to 4.30pm.

State Schools Spectacular

The annual Victorian State Schools Spectacular is an invaluable performing arts opportunity for our Years 7-12 students. State Schools Spectacular and the CSC Dance Academy encourages creative skills, discipline, perseverance and confidence over months of rehearsals.

Colac Secondary College has been a lead performing school the past two years. Students in the VSSS team spend 4 days in Melbourne each year to prepare and perform two shows in front of a crowd of thousands, including cameras to capture the performances for broadcast on Channel 7.

Instrumental Music

Colac Secondary College provides students with the option of a free specialised instrumental music program. Students are rostered out of normal classes to receive weekly tuition from specialised instrumental music teachers. We have a range of instruments available for hire at a minimal fee.

College Productions

Colac Secondary College are proud to present the opportunity for all students to participate in our school musical productions. CSC has seen the stage light up with musicals such as Fame (2015), Legally Blonde (2017), Grease (2019), The Addams Family (2021), Peter Pan (2023), and Frozen, being produced this year!



Student Leadership Program

CSCs Student Leadership Program offers unique and free professional development opportunities to develop students leadership skills.

We have developed a bespoke program for our student leaders, providing unique leadership opportunities, guest speakers, and excursions to enhance leadership capabilities. Students will also have the opportunity to be involved in the College Student Representative Council SRC and lead their houses on sports days.

Victorian High-Ability Program

The Victorian High-Ability Program is an extension course running for one school term, where selected students will meet with like-minded peers at neighbouring Victorian government schools through weekly virtual lessons. The weekly virtual lessons will occur during the school day and will be taught by expert Virtual School Victoria educators. Students are selected to participate in this program based on their previous performance in NAPLAN and school based assessment tasks. This program runs as an enrichment and extension opportunity and does not replace teaching and learning programs.

Literacy Intervention Program

Colac Secondary College's English and Literacy programs are closely integrated. Our English and Literacy instruction is based on the science of learning and reading. Grounded in evidence-based methodologies, we prioritise the foundational skills of reading comprehension, spelling and grammar, writing for specific purposes, and developing analytical thinking. Supporting students who need extra help in literacy is one of our top priorities. We are proud to offer an intensive literacy support program that allows us to diagnose students' individual literacy needs and provide targeted instruction to help them catch up as soon as possible. We integrate phonics instruction to enhance reading fluency and decoding skills, ensuring students have a strong foundation in word recognition. Additionally, explicit instruction in morphology, grammar and vocabulary expands students' linguistic repertoire and enhances their written communication. For all students, we use continuous monitoring and assessment to allow us to tailor our instruction to meet student needs.





College Camps

Camps are a core element of the student experience at Colac Secondary College. The Year 7 camp is held at the start of the school year to help foster positive social and emotional relationships. In Year 8, students also enjoy a camp focused on personal development and growth. Year 9 students enjoy experiences on the Melbourne Discovery camp and the Great Ocean walk. In the Senior School, students have the opportunity to attend camps in Central Australia, Far North Queensland, and the Kokoda Track (PNG).



Buddy Program

The Year 7 Buddy Program exists at Colac Secondary College to support the transition process for the Year 6 students from primary to secondary school. The role of the Year 10 Buddies (who they will meet on Orientation Day) is to provide a friendly face for the new students, to support them on their visits and assist with information about the way Colac Secondary College works from a student's point of view. Prior to Orientation Day our Buddies are selected from our Year 9 Student Leadership cohort and are trained in 'get to know you' games, ice breakers and initiative activities. They also learn about respectful relationships and inclusive practices at Colac Secondary College to ensure everyone's wellbeing is being looked after. The Buddy role continues the following year where our Buddies work alongside our new Year 7 students in their classroom. The program not only helps the Year 6 students feel at ease in their new surroundings but it is an excellent opportunity for our Year 9 students to gain further leadership experience.



Compass

Compass School Manager is a whole-school administration package.

It is used by the College to streamline many school operations, from attendance, communication, event management and student wellbeing. The College aims for Compass to increasingly become a central portal for communication between the College and yourself.

Key features available to parents are: My News, Student Profile, Organisation, Events, Permission Forms & Consent, Online Payments, Reports, Interviews and so much more.

Instructional Model

At CSC, learning intentions are framed as 'Essential Questions'. These make it clear to students that the learning associated with the Essential Question is designed to enhance their understanding of content knowledge or skills.

The CSC Instructional Model is used to consistently structure learning sessions, to support students in their learner confidence and growth. Our Instructional Model is firmly based on the latest research into how students best learn.

Review Learning


The purpose of reviewing learning is to reinforce and consolidate knowledge. Regular review helps to strengthen students' retention of information, enhance their understanding, and promote long-term memory. By revisiting and reinforcing previously learned material, students solidify their grasp of key concepts and skills, contributing to more effective learning outcomes.

Sequence Learning

Sequencing learning involves presenting information in a structured and logical order, progressing from simpler concepts to more complex ones to enhance comprehension and skill development. The purpose of providing models and scaffolds is to offer examples and support to guide students in understanding and applying new material. Multiple exposures are integrated to reinforce learning, facilitating retention and long-term memory, ultimately aiming for a solid and enduring grasp of the content.

Apply Learning

Applying learning is designed to facilitate the transfer of acquired knowledge and skills. This involves guiding student practice and providing numerous opportunities for application. The goal is to achieve a high success rate during practice sessions, fostering confidence and reinforcing learning. Through a combination of guided and independent practice, students can solidify their understanding, promoting meaningful retention and the ability to independently apply their knowledge and skills.



ICT Information

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program – 2026

The BYOD program is designed to provide students with the tools and resources needed for success in their learning journey. By incorporating technology into the curriculum, the school is ensuring that students are well-prepared for a future where digital literacy is essential. This increased access to technology enables students to unlock their full potential and develop key learning skills through the use of digital tools.

Families can choose to bring their own laptop from home or purchase a new device through our online portal with Learning with Technologies (LWT).

Megan and Ellie are available for all students as a counsellor to support and assist them through issues and/ or concerns they may be experiencing. They are able to meet with students, parents, carers and teachers by appointment.

Secondary Schools Nurse

The role of the Secondary School Nurse is to improve and support the health and wellbeing of students at CSC through health promotion activities, class work and one on one consultations in areas of adolescent health. The Secondary School Nurse does not administer First Aid, so students will need to continue to see the designated first aid officer.

You will find the School Nurse in the Student Wellbeing Area.

The Doctors in Secondary Schools Program (DISS) is run through CSC.

Dr Zoe Barren MBBS. FRACGP. DRANZCOG(Adv) is the GP that visits the school every Wednesday, within the school term. Lesley O'Donnell is the Nurse associated with the DISS program.

The DISS clinic is a bulk-bill service, which means no charge to your child. Dr Barren is available by appointment on Wednesdays to see young people at school. Appointments can be made via the wellbeing team, dropping in during a break to see the Nurse or by emailing medicalclinic@colac-sc.vic.edu.au

Mental Health Practitioner Kristie Malone

Kristie is a social worker and her role at CSC is to provide short-term clinical mental health intervention to young people who may have mild to moderate mental health concerns such as anxiety and depression. Kristie is available by referral only through the wellbeing team and works on Mondays, Tuesdays and every other Wednesday.
